April 7: Building Blessing

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From Adam Bryant, Council Member—Cleaning has never been my strongest quality. From a young age, I've always been one of those people who starts cleaning my room, finds something I haven't seen for a while and then becomes totally enraptured with that. Or even better is when I get the great idea to reorganize my bookshelves! Taking the books out is easy

and feels like progress in a way (not sure what it says about how good I am at making a mess instead of cleaning them...), but when I start organizing the books and then have to put them into the shelves - well let's just say it is easy to get bogged down there no matter how clever of a new organization strategy I have cooked up.

This is all to say how impressed I have been by the work our congregation has done through the Lenten season and Bless This Mess. If you haven't had a chance to see, we as a congregation have:

- 1.Relocated the workroom to the former pastor's office;
- 2. Cleaned out the nursery room, including sorting through items in the nursery room;
- 3. Combined the nursery and wiggle rooms to a space that looks more comfortable for both uses and allows parents to continue to participate in worship;
- 4. Painted the wiggle room;
- 5. Sorted and condensed the library;
- 6. Reframed broken art pieces;
- 7. Cleaned and organized the cabinets by the fellowship space and kitchen allowing for more shared storage for our user groups;
- 8. Countless other tasks!

Now as we move into Easter and beyond, we also move from Bless This Mess into the more exciting mission of finding new uses for our space. Perhaps the former nursery space can become classroom space for something like the Olé education program? Or maybe a coworking-style space for people in the community or congregation who need a quiet space for an important Zoom meeting or a

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telehealth call? Maybe you have a fantastic idea that we haven't considered! Our property is a gift, not only for us but for our neighbors, and I am excited to see what ways we can think up to use that gift.

From Tom Middendorf, Council Member — The Bless This Mess initiative has made great strides in cleaning out church interior spaces. One of the next steps by the Church Council and others has been to identify possible church improvements in the refreshed space. The Council has authorized spending up to \$10,000 of Memorial Funds to complete some initial upgrades. Improvements identified so far are listed below. Names in (example) are people who have already offered to lead the improvement.


Churchwide	Additional interior painting and ceiling tile replacement. Thanks to Richard Clendaniel and others for repainting several rooms already.
Sanctuary	Remove chairs that no longer have back support and clean/oil chair wood surfaces. Paint all surfaces below the windows and the stained areas on the beams above the windows (Steve O'Donnell). Wash windows (Tom Middendorf). Replace old speaker wire for organ. Install garland hangers. Install covering or improve storage area along back wall by sound system desk. Purchase and install a new banner holder in the storage area behind the altar.
Wiggle Room	Install a speaker connected to the sanctuary sound system (Pastor Liz).
Coat Room	Bless This Mess cleanout still needed. Paint.
Narthex	Purchase new table outside pastor's office. Improve storage for food barrel and clothes barrel items. Purchase new comfortable chairs near the front door. More signs outside rooms. Eventually replace carpeting.
Former Work Room	Remove mail boxes.
New Work Room	Purchase/install a standing work station/cabinet (Todd Bryant). Purchase/install a safe (Todd Bryant).
Men's Bathroom	Replace vinyl flooring and base cove (Todd Bryant bid). Minor painting of toilet stall and stains on ceiling tiles.
Women's Bathroom	Replace old supplies cabinet.

Children's	Strip /www.floors
	Strip/wax floors.
Bathrooms	
Theatre Room	Bless This Mess cleanout still needed.
	Currently being used for storage. If this use continues, consider shelving/storage options.
Library	Install locking system for closets?
Nursery	Replace broken window, replace overhead light lens cover (Todd Bryant bids).
Fireside	Replace several broken windows (Todd Bryant bids).
Room	Eventually remove fireplace.
	Purchase folding table cart.
Youth Room	Make final decisions on tossing, saving, donating items stored here.
Outdoor	Outdoor spring cleaning, raking, pavement cleaning.
Needs	Resurface pavements.
	Paint/new siding on north/west sides of church exterior.
	Reroof oldest roof sections over the sanctuary and classroom wing.
	Replace glycol in heated slab (Todd Bryant bid).
	Inspect/maintain/clean up playground equipment.
	Improve visibility of church sign.
	improve visionity of church sign.

Harvest of Hope I know it doesn't seem like we should be talking about the garden




